

All Landing Rights Requestors:

San Bernardino International Airport (KSBD) is designated as a “landing rights airport” [19CFR 122.1(f); 19 CFR 122.14]. Office hours and services for inspection of arriving aircraft are Monday through Friday, 0800- 1700 PST. Phone calls and e-mails are not monitored outside of office hours. Pilots must secure permission to land by contacting CBP at least one business day prior to departure from foreign. Email requests can be sent to ksbd.ga@cbp.dhs.gov.

Upon receipt of the landing rights request, SBD CBP will respond that the request for landing rights has been received. Prior to emailing a landing rights request ensure that EAPIS has been filed.

Part 135 landing rights requests must include the following information:

- e-APIS Confirmation Number
- Date of arrival to KSBD (local date)
- ETA (local time)
- FBO
- Tail number
- Number of passengers
- Number of crew
- Carrier code and flight number
- Routing of flight (four letter code)
- International Carrier (Activity Code Type 3) bond number
- Do you have a Southern Border Overflight Exemption (BOE), if necessary?

Part 91 landing rights requests must include the following information:

- e-APIS Confirmation Number
- Date of arrival to KSBD (local date)
- ETA (local time)
- FBO
- Tail number
- Number of passengers
- Number of crew
- Routing of flight (four letter code)
- Do you have a Southern Border Overflight Exemption (BOE), if necessary?

As reminder for both Part 91 and 135 passengers utilizing the Visa Waiver Program (VWP) insure the following two items: that your carrier is a VWP signatory carrier and that the passengers have a valid approved ESTA.

In addition to landing rights requests, modifications and cancelations may also be made via SBD CBP’s mailbox at ksbd.ga@cbp.dhs.gov.

Lastly, a landing rights request does not constitute approval of landing rights at SBD. An email will be sent when landing rights is granted.
